Our services include Acute Medical, Surgical, Day Procedure Unit, Residential Aged Care, Community Nursing, Day Oncology, and Urgent Care Centre. Our theatre provides General, Orthopaedic, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, ENT and Endoscopic surgery. On-site support includes Pathology, Pharmacy and Medical Imaging Services. A comprehensive team of Primary Care staff provide on-site and community services.

Graduates are supported through the program by members of the Education Team. A Clinical Nurse Educator coordinates the program and works closely with graduates and preceptors to ensure a smooth and successful transition into professional practice.

Rotation areas for Graduates may include: Acute (medical/surgical), Theatre and Residential Aged Care with opportunities to gain experience in Day Oncology, District Nursing and in the Urgent Care Centre.

The program also includes:

- Continued support from educators and experienced preceptors in each rotation area
- Supernumerary time in each clinical rotation
- Fortnightly graduate support and/or education sessions
- Achievement of clinical competencies (e.g. IV cannulation)
- Study days and networking opportunities with other graduates within the region.
